





#### **Hong Kong Young Writers Award**

Congratulations to 30 of our students for their excellent results in the competition hosted by the Shanghai Education Bureau. The topic was 'The City I Love – Shanghai', and many of them received prizes in different categories. Among them, there were four first prizes, 10 second prizes and 16 third prizes. The faculty received three teaching awards for Outstanding Guidance, while SSIS also received the *Outstanding Organization Award and Cultural Communication Award*.

Units included aquatics, gymnastics, locomotor skills and non-locomotor skills.









#### **Creative Arts 3D Modelling Competition**

We were overwhelmed with the news that our Primary students had won quite a few prizes in the **2**<sup>nd</sup> **Creative Arts 3D Modelling Competition**—organised by China's Association for Children's Art and supported by the Shanghai Youth Centre and M&G Chenguang Stationery Co. Ltd. The 11 SSIS competitors showed their independence and creativity, and they came out tops, securing first, second and third prizes in various categories.

#### **Art Pieces Selected for ParkwayHealth Calendar**

Our young artists were invited to take part in the health provider's 15th Annual Art Charity Calendar Contest. The theme 'Healthy Families' resonated with our students—in the 7-12 age group category—who produced a rich variety of works that delighted the judges. Seven of their artwork were featured in the ParkwayHealth 2020 calendar which was sold to raise funds for charity.

#### 'Go Wuhan, Go China' Art Competition

In the competition organised by Shanghai Family (a magazine for international families in Shanghai), SSIS students won a slew of awards with their artwork for the theme 'Go Wuhan, Go China'. To show support and send best wishes to Wuhan and China, our Primary students sent 226 entries and two of them won third place prizes (out of over 1,000 entries from 82 international and local schools in Shanghai.)









#### A First: Senior School Immersive Drama Performance

On 5–6 December, the Senior School students produced a breakthrough piece of theatre that will be talked about for years. *Café Murder* was an immersive play that needed the collaboration of actors, musicians, backstage crew and extras, and the participation of the audience to work. This year's drama performance was a real treat to all of us, and a benchmark from the SSIS drama community.







# SSIS IB Online Virtual Art Exhibition Featured in Hua Cao Community Magazine

The IB Visual Art Exhibition marked the end of a rigorous two-year course. While the exhibition is usually set up on campus, this year, it was presented online. Selected works of our IB visual artists were featured in the Hua Cao Community Magazine *Hi-Life*.

## Short Film Selected for International Film Festival

'妈 *Ma*', a short film by CHEAH Victoria, Grade 12, won second place in the High School Fiction section of the COVID-19 International Student Film Festival. Her film was selected from hundreds of entries from 76 schools in 30 countries on six continents.



## Awards from the Shanghai International Student Film Festival

Going from our previous best of two first-placed films last year to seven this year showed a remarkable improvement in the use of media and technology across the whole school. The festival (in its 14th year) attracted hundreds of entries from around the world. This was the second year running SSIS had entered films—and won awards—in all age groups (Preschool, Primary and Senior School), and the first time we had won first place in a Senior School category.







### **Our Faculty**

Our teachers are passionate educators who are committed to the guiding principles of SSIS. They come from more than 20 different countries to deliver the rigorous SSIS curriculum and to support student learning. We recruit faculty and staff who are not only highly-qualified but who exemplify the spirit of the SSIS community.

#### **Professional Development**

As a school that values lifelong learning for the entire community of students, staff and parents, we focus heavily on faculty education. There are various opportunities provided for teachers to receive external Professional Development (PD), as well as teach one another in avenues such as Peer Coaching and Mini Conferences—which we conduct twice a year.





#### **Mini-Conferences**

The AY19/20 Mini-Conference took place in December. The participation rate was 100 per cent, and a variety of good proposals were submitted. The more popular ones focused on early childhood literacy, effective use of technology in the classroom, teaching strategies to assist students with learning difficulties, and also some subject-specific workshops. One of the sessions took place outside the school campus at the Art Museum and focused on interdisciplinary integrations.

#### **EduTECH Asia 2019 in Singapore**

On 4-6 November, our key faculty members attended EduTECH Asia 2019 in Singapore. Justin KILGORE, our STEAM Coach, was invited to present 'Why Coding is the New Literacy' to a packed conference. Big names in the EduTECH space were present to show off their latest developments during the three-day exhibition. Our education team was there to witness where technology and education intersected, meet like-minded people who were embracing change, and to learn from experts at the forefront of the industry.















#### **Sino-Foreign Teacher Partnership Project**

SSIS is committed to immersing our faculty in exchange programmes. By doing so, we get a richer perspective of life outside campus, gain a critical understanding of our methods and pedagogy, and are better able to lead and inspire. SSIS hosted the 'Sino-Foreign Teacher Partnership Project in Hua Cao Town, 2019' (18–25 November) for the educators from Hua Cao Town. The professional development programme—'Explore and Practice Education Informatization for Course Development'—provided for a group of teacher-learners to observe lessons and be immersed in workshops. They explored our uses of technology for teaching and learning, approaches to Digital Citizenship, STEAM programme, cross-curricular integration, student empowerment, and EduTECH coaching programme.





From principals to bus drivers, kitchen staff, Health Centre staff, security, administrative and maintenance staff, we stress the importance of all school employees working together to help our students succeed. Each staff member may have different responsibilities, but the educational role we play remains the same—we are all role models to every child in the school.









#### **Recognition by Parents**

In September last year, the school's security team received a banner from a group of Preschool parents, acknowledging the hard work that the team performs tirelessly.

In June this year, our appreciative PSG Executive Committee presented four banners to the school to recognise the excellent service provided by the members of these departments: security personnel, Health Centre staff, kitchen staff and cleaners. We are heartened that the indispensable work by our support staff is acknowledged.

#### **New Health Centre Supervisor**

We extend a warm welcome to Becky LIU, our new Health Centre Supervisor who joined us in June. She is a Senior Nutritionist and Supervisor Nurse with 13 years of nursing experience and five years of management experience. Her work experience included stints at Jiahui International Hospital, American-Sino Women and Children's Hospital and Landseed Hospital. Other than maintaining the daily operations of the school's Health Centre, Becky plans to use her nutritional knowledge to work with Chef Jin to enhance the quality of our school lunches.










#### **Pre-CAS and CAS Journeys**

#### **Covid-19 Response Team**

At all times and in every situation, a child must feel safe, and we must protect them from any circumstance or practice that may result in the compromise of their physical or emotional well-being. We would like to welcome Mr Alan WEST as the Child Protection Officer for next academic year. Mr WEST is also our Senior School's counsellor and has many years of experience in the field of social-emotional support for teenagers and children. He will be the designated point of contact for any issues or concerns regarding the safety and well-being of a child.

#### **Campus Safety**


The Campus Safety Committee, comprising school administrators and Operation Managers, meet monthly to scrutinise all aspects of Campus Safety such as bus safety, equipment and facilities. Primary School PE HOD Mr WU Song, our appointed Campus Safety Officer, will oversee the implementation of fire evacuation, lockdown drills and Covid-19 measures as part of his Campus Safety portfolio. He will also coordinate with the Campus Safety Committee, made up of CLT members and Operations Managers, to ensure the safety of school premises and equipment.

## Looking Ahead

To prepare our students to be resilient, relevant and empowered future leaders, we continually review and redesign our curricula and upgrade our learning environment.













#### **Cambridge Lower Secondary Programme**

The Cambridge Lower Secondary Programme (CLSP), from this academic year onwards, is the latest addition to our arsenal of recognised international curricula. CLSP provides a natural progression from Primary education as well as a strong foundation to pursue the IGCSE curriculum in Grades 9 to 10 and the IBDP in Grades 11 to 12.

The CLSP curriculum encourages learners to become confident in working with information and ideas, and be responsible, reflective, innovative and engaged in the learning process. It is designed to help schools deliver a broad and balanced curriculum that suits their context, culture and ethos, and shape the programme around how they want their students to learn. Students also take a Pastoral Care course which supports them in developing the skills necessary to achieve success in a social environment and provides a career exploration focus, as well.

## Chinese Language and Culture Programme Enhancement

In this academic year, our Chinese Language and Culture Programme will be setting up a student-centred broadcasting CCA known as Sabres Broadcast. This provides students with the platform to hone their public speaking skills, boost confidence levels and become proficiently bilingual.



#### **Embracing Technology in Education**

#### Preschool:

K2 students will access apps on iPad to practise reading and writing. Introducing programming to K2 students will help to actively prepare them for their seamless transition into Grade 1 Primary curriculum, where they will engage with STEAM and ICT lessons. Our ICT team will work with Preschool teachers to introduce pre-coding concepts to our K2 students.

#### Primary:

We are using versatile new resources to prepare our students for maker mentalities, technical skill sets, and design thinking processes needed to explore the core curriculum. We are embedding them with 21st-century skills and preparing them for robust STEAM and Design Technology programs.

#### Senior:

We are integrating STEAM principles into the core curriculum for G7 and G8. At the same time, all G7-G9 students will have had experience with the STEAM programme (50 per cent of the population in the Senior School will have had STEAM experience in AY 2020-2021.) This has been systematically implemented to prepare Senior students for the opening of the Senior Innovation Space.
